3. Approval of the Agenda

Mayor Copeland called for a motion to approve the Agenda. Councilmember Pruitt motioned and Mayor Pro Tem Elrod seconded. The vote was five in favor. Those voting in favor were Mayor Copeland, Mayor Pro Tem Elrod, Councilmember Pruett, Councilmember Pruitt and Councilmember Vincent. Councilmembers Stewart and Varner were not present for the meeting.

**6. Discussion and possible adoption
of an emergency/disaster ordinance**

**Jim Elliott
City Attorney**

City Attorney Jim Elliott discussed the need for the City to consider the adoption of an emergency/disaster ordinance in light of the recent worldwide pandemic of COVID-19. He said that the Ordinance would provide that the Mayor, working in conjunction with the Henry County Emergency Management Agency have the authority to declare a public emergency and impose certain requirements. At a time when the emergency is determined to be over, the Council can vote to terminate the emergency status. Additionally, emergency situations will last no more than 30 days unless removed by the Mayor.

Mr. Elliott further noted that certain powers can be given to different entities for enforcement, and he said that the City may seek injunctive relief from business owners and citizens who do not comply with emergency requirements. Discussion ensued.

Councilmember Pruitt asked about the citizens' Right to Bear Arms and whether or not this Ordinance will impact that Constitutional Right. Mr. Elliott said that the Second Amendment is a part of the U.S. Constitution, and that this Ordinance would have no impact that right. Councilmember Vincent asked that public be adequately informed that this Ordinance will not impact any of their Constitutional Rights.

Mayor Copeland called for a motion to approve the Emergency/Disaster Ordinance for the City of McDonough. Councilmember Pruett motioned and Councilmember Varner seconded. The vote was six in favor. The motion passed. Those voting in favor were Mayor Copeland, Mayor Pro Tem Elrod, Councilmember Pruett, Councilmember Pruitt, Councilmember Varner and Councilmember Vincent. Councilmember Stewart was not present at the meeting.

7. Adjournment
