6. REAL Training for Elected Officials (Race, Equity and Leadership)

Mr. Leon Andrews, REAL (Race, Equity and Leadership) Director and Ms. Betsy Hodges, Co-Facilitator with the National League of Cities attended the meeting virtually to provide REAL Training for the City of McDonough City Council. The purpose of the training is to try to help City leaders navigate and understand the need for social change and racial equity in leadership.

The four objectives stated for REAL training are listed below:

- Develop a shared understanding of language and terminology
- Understanding history and current events
- Introduce framework that will serve as an effective foundation
- How to use racial equity tools to derive results

The mission of the REAL program is to build local leaders' knowledge and capacity to eliminate racial disparities, heal racial divisions and build more equitable communities. The vision of REAL is a nation in which every local official is equipped to effectively lead and serve an inclusive, thriving and healthy community.

Some of the topics discussed in the training are listed below:

- The aim of the program is to clarify the urgency of the need for change.
- The goal is to have measurable change for people whose lives are negatively impacted by racial inequity.
- Operationalizing and organizing is an important part of creating a space to normalize.

During the meeting, the elected officials viewed a video on the history of race and they participated in various exercises.
